Get help from an attorney or accredited representative.

Attorneys have legal training and are not subject to any order restricting their ability to practice law.

Accredited representatives are accredited by the Department of Justice's (DOJ's) Office of Legal Access Programs (OLAP) and working for DOJ recognized organizations.

These two types of authorized immigration service providers are allowed to:

- Represent you in your immigration matter before USCIS;
- Give you advice about which documents to submit;
- Explain immigration options you may have; and
- Communicate with USCIS about your case.
