CHART NAME: APPLICATIONS FOR IMMIGRATION BENEFITS


WHAT IT DISPLAYS: The below chart provides data on applications and petitions received by USCIS for immigration benefits in September 2012. This chart excludes all data associated with the citizenship related applications.

WHAT IT SHOWS: Immigration application receipts increased by 38 percent compared to the number received in September 2011. September 2012 approvals decreased by 9 percent, denials decreased by 33 percent, and pending increased by 13% compared to September 2011.

- Major volumes of pending applications at the end of September 2012 include: 652,720 I-130 immediate/all other petitions; 344,301 I-485 applications to adjust status; 128,611 I-751 remove conditions spouse jointly/waive; 112,636 I-765 employment authorizations; 103,237 I-90 green card renewals/replacements; 96,300 I-129 forms filed; 43,278 I-131 travel document/advance parole.
