DISCUSSION: The visa petition was denied by the Director, Nebraska Service Center. On March 13, 2002, it came before the Administrative Appeals Office (AAO) on appeal. On April 8, 2003, the petitioner, through its President, requested that the petition and appeal be withdrawn as to the named beneficiary. 8 C.F.R. § 103.2(b)(6). As an affected party, the petitioner may withdraw the appeal. 8 C.F.R. § 103.3(a)(2)(ix). This decision must be served on the affected party and its attorney or representative of record. 8 C.F.R. § 103.3(a)(2)(x). Only the named counsel, *supra*, has presented a Notice of Entry or Appearance of Attorney or Representative (Form G-28) and is entitled to notice on behalf of the petitioner. 8 C.F.R. § 103.3(a)(2)(v)(2)(i). Another attorney, who has not filed any G-28 despite repeated requests, has no standing to appeal or receive notice of the proceedings.

ORDER: The appeal is dismissed based on its withdrawal by the petitioner.
