**DISCUSSION:** The Director, Nebraska Service Center, denied the nonimmigrant visa petition. The matter is now before the Administrative Appeals Office (AAO) on appeal. The appeal will be rejected.

When the director denied the petition on September 19, 2003, the director correctly indicated that the regulations make no provision to allow the petitioner to appeal the denial of an R-1 nonimmigrant visa petition.

Because there is no provision to allow the petitioner to appeal the director's decision, the appeal cannot be accepted, and therefore must be rejected.

Apart from the Form I-290B Notice of Appeal, other materials submitted by the petitioner refer to the filing as a motion to reopen or reconsider. Pursuant to 8 C.F.R. § 103.5(a)(1)(ii), jurisdiction over motions lies with the office that rendered the decision that is the subject of the motion, in this case the Nebraska Service Center.

**ORDER:** The appeal is rejected.
