





**DISCUSSION:** The Director of the Texas Service Center denied the nonimmigrant visa petition and the matter is now before the Administrative Appeals Office (AAO) on appeal. The appeal will be rejected pursuant to 8 C.F.R. § 103.3(a)(2)(v)(A).

The petitioner is an Internet auction company that seeks to employ the beneficiary as a contract administrator. The director denied the petition on the basis that the proffered position did not meet the definition of a specialty occupation.

The Form G-28, Entry of Appearance as Attorney or Representative, that was submitted in conjunction with the appeal was signed by the beneficiary, not by an authorized representative of the petitioner. The previous G-28 filed with the original petition by another attorney of record and dated August 1, 2002, was also signed by the beneficiary. Citizenship and Immigration Services (CIS) regulations specifically prohibit a beneficiary of a visa petition, or a representative acting on a beneficiary's behalf, from filing a petition; the beneficiary of a visa petition is not a recognized party in a proceeding. 8 C.F.R. § 103.2(a)(3). As the beneficiary and her representative are not recognized parties, counsel is not authorized to file an appeal. 8 C.F.R. § 103.3(a)(1)(iii)(B). As the appeal was not properly filed, it will be rejected. 8 C.F.R. § 103.3(a)(2)(v)(A)(1).

**ORDER:** The appeal is rejected.
