DISCUSSION: The service center director denied the nonimmigrant visa petition and the matter is now before the Administrative Appeals Office (AAO) on appeal. The matter will be remanded to the director.

The petitioner is a skilled nursing facility that seeks to employ the beneficiary as a medical records administrator. The petitioner endeavors to classify the beneficiary as a nonimmigrant worker in a specialty occupation pursuant to section 101(a)(15)(H)(i)(b) of the Immigration and Nationality Act (the Act), 8 U.S.C. § 1101(a)(15)(H)(i)(b). The director denied the petition on the basis that the proffered position did not meet the definition of a specialty occupation.

Counsel submitted a timely Form I-290B on May 27, 2003 stating that he had received the denial letter without the attachment explaining the reason for the denial, and requesting that a new notice of decision be sent to him.

Therefore, the matter will be remanded to the director to reissue a complete copy of the decision. The petitioner will be afforded a period of 30 days after reissuance of the full decision in which to supplement the appeal.

ORDER: The petition is remanded to the director for reissuance of the decision.
