DISCUSSION: The waiver application was denied by the District Director, St. Paul, Minnesota. The matter is now before the Administrative Appeals Office on appeal. On February 15, 2008, USCIS received a letter from the petitioner, Connie Kirama, dated January 28, 2008, withdrawing the underlying Form I-130, Petition for Alien Relative, and the Form I-864, Affidavit of Support, she filed on the applicant's behalf. Given the petitioner's withdrawal, there is no longer an underlying petition to support the instant waiver application. The appeal will therefore be dismissed.

ORDER: The appeal is dismissed based on the withdrawal of the underlying petition.
