

DISCUSSION: The termination of temporary resident status by the Director, Western Service Center is now before the Administrative Appeals Office on appeal. The appeal will be rejected.

The director terminated the applicant's status because of his criminal record.

An adverse decision on an application for temporary resident status may be appealed to the Administrative Appeals Office. Any appeal with the required fee shall be filed with the Service Center within thirty (30) days after service of the notice of denial. An appeal received after the thirty day period has tolled will not be accepted. *See* 8 C.F.R. § 245a.2(p).

The director issued the Notice of Termination on February 18, 1993, and mailed it to the applicant's address of record. The postal receipt in the record demonstrates the applicant signed for the notice the next day. The appeal was received on December 10, 2003. Therefore, the appeal was untimely filed, and must be rejected.

ORDER: The appeal is rejected.
