DISCUSSION: The applicant's Temporary Protected Status (TPS) was withdrawn by the District Director, Atlanta, Georgia, and is now before the Administrative Appeals Office (AAO) on appeal. The appeal will be summarily dismissed as moot, because the designated period of TPS for Montserrat terminated on February 27, 2005.

The applicant is a native and citizen of Montserrat who was granted Temporary Protected Status on December 18, 1997.

On July 6, 2004, the Department of Homeland Security announced the termination of the designation of TPS for nationals of Montserrat (or aliens having no nationality who last habitually resided in Montserrat). As the designation period for which the applicant requests TPS has passed, adjudication of the application at this time would serve no practical effect since any decision rendered by the AAO would be subsequent to the date of the termination date of the authorized period.

ORDER: The application is summarily dismissed.
