DISCUSSION: The initial application was denied by the Director, Texas Service Center. The initial application will be reopened, *sua sponte*, by the Chief, Administrative Appeals Office, and the application will be approved. A subsequent application for re-registration was denied by the Director, California Service Center, and is currently before the Administrative Appeals Office (AAO) on appeal. The appeal will be sustained and the application will be approved.

The applicant is a citizen of Nicaragua who is seeking Temporary Protected Status (TPS) under section 244 of the Immigration and Nationality Act (the Act), 8 U.S.C. § 1254.

The applicant filed an initial application for TPS under receipt number SRC 03 198 54816. The Director, Texas Service Center, denied the initial application on September 19, 2003, after determining that the applicant had failed to establish his eligibility for late registration.

On appeal, the applicant states that he qualifies for late registration as a spouse of a TPS registrant. The record reveals that the applicant's wife [Alien Registration Number] is a TPS registrant.

Since the applicant appears to have overcome the sole ground for the denial of his initial application for TPS, that decision has been withdrawn. The record of proceedings contains sufficient evidence to establish the applicant's eligibility for TPS and does not reflect any other grounds that would bar the applicant from receiving TPS. Therefore, the initial application will be approved.

The director's denial of the application for re-registration or renewal is dependent upon the adjudication of the initial application. Since the initial application is being approved, the appeal from the denial of the re-registration will be sustained and that application will also be approved.

ORDER: The application is reopened and the director's denial of the initial application is withdrawn. The initial application and the re-registration application are both approved.
