**DISCUSSION:** The application was denied by the Philadelphia, Pennsylvania District Office, and is now before the Administrative Appeals Office (AAO) on appeal. The appeal will be dismissed as moot.

The applicant is a native and citizen of Liberia who is seeking Temporary Protected Status (TPS) under section 244 of the Immigration and Nationality Act (the Act), 8 U.S.C. § 1254.

The applicant was initially approved for TPS on July 3, 2003.

On May 10, 2004, the district director withdrew the applicant's TPS because he had failed to re-register for TPS during the re-registration period.

The applicant filed an appeal on June 24, 2004.

The record of proceedings shows that the applicant filed another TPS application receipt number EAC 06 012 70672, on October 12, 2005. The record also shows that that application was approved by the Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, District Office on March 8, 2006. As the applicant has been approved for TPS, the issues in this proceeding are moot.

**ORDER:** The appeal is dismissed.
