

DISCUSSION: The initial application was denied, reopened, and denied again by the Director, Texas Service Center (TSC). A subsequent application for re-registration was denied by the Director, California Service Center, and is currently before the Administrative Appeals Office (AAO) on appeal. The initial application will be reopened, *sua sponte*, by the Chief, Administrative Appeals Office, and the case will be remanded for further consideration and action.

The applicant is a citizen of El Salvador who is seeking Temporary Protected Status (TPS) under section 244 of the Immigration and Nationality Act (the Act), 8 U.S.C. § 1254.

The record reveals that the applicant filed an initial application [SRC 01 182 55827] on April 16, 2001. The director denied that application on February 24, 2003, due to abandonment because the applicant failed to appear for his scheduled fingerprint appointment. On September 19, 2003, the director reopened the decision and on March 10, 2004, requested the applicant to submit evidence regarding his qualifying continuous residence and continuous presence in the United States. The TSC director determined that the applicant failed to respond to the March 10, 2004, request for evidence and denied the application again on June 9, 2004, due to abandonment.

The applicant filed the instant Form I-821, Application for Temporary Protected Status, on February 25, 2005. The director denied this application on August 16, 2005, because the applicant's initial TPS application had been denied and the applicant was not eligible to apply for re-registration for TPS.

A review of the record of proceedings reflects that the applicant had responded to the TSC director's March 10, 2004, request.

The director's denial of the initial application will be withdrawn; the application will be remanded for a new decision. The director's denial of the application for re-registration or renewal is dependent upon the adjudication of the initial application. Since the initial application is being remanded, that decision will be remanded to the director for further adjudication. The director may request any evidence deemed necessary to assist with the determination of the applicant's eligibility for TPS offered to El Salvadorans.

As always in these proceedings, the burden of proof rests solely with the applicant. Section 291 of the Act, 8 U.S.C. § 1361.

ORDER: The initial application is reopened, the director's decision is withdrawn, and the application is remanded for a new decision. The re-registration application is remanded for further action consistent with the director's new decision on the initial application.
