

DISCUSSION: The application was denied by the Director, California Service Center (CSC), and is now before the Administrative Appeals Office (AAO) on appeal. The appeal will be sustained.

The applicant is a native and citizen of El Salvador who is applying for Temporary Protected Status (TPS) under section 244 of the Immigration and Nationality Act (the Act), 8 U.S.C. § 1254.

The director denied the re-registration application on August 16, 2005, because the applicant's initial TPS application had been denied and the applicant was not eligible to apply for re-registration for TPS.

The record reflects that on November 15, 2006, the Director, Texas Service Center (TSC) reopened the applicant's case on motion after an appeal of the applicant's denial was remanded to the TSC by the AAO and approved his application. Since the initial application has been approved, the appeal from the denial of the re-registration will be sustained and that application will also be approved.

An alien applying for temporary protected status has the burden of proving that he or she meets the above requirements and is eligible under the provisions of section 244 of the Act. The applicant has met this burden.

ORDER: The appeal for the re-registration application is sustained.
