

DISCUSSION: The application was denied by the Director, Vermont Service Center (VSC), and is now before the Administrative Appeals Office on appeal. The case will be remanded.

The applicant is a native and citizen of EI Salvador who is seeking Temporary Protected Status (TPS) under section 244 of the Immigration and Nationality Act (the Act), 8 U.S.C. § 1254.

The record reveals that the applicant filed a Form 1-821, Application for Temporary Protected Status, under receipt number SRC 03 014 55092. The Director, Texas Service Center, (TSC), denied that application on July 31, 2003, after determining that the applicant had abandoned his application by failing to appear for fingerprinting. The applicant's motion to reconsider was denied by the TSC Director on July 8, 2004.

The applicant filed the current application, on February 9, 2005, and indicated that he was re-registering for TPS.

The VSC Director evidently denied the re-registration application. However, a copy of that determination is not in the record of proceedings.

ORDER: The case is remanded to the director for further consideration and action.
