DISCUSSION: The waiver application was denied by the Field Office Director, Ho Chi Minh City, Vietnam, and is now before the Administrative Appeals Office (AAO) on appeal. The appeal will be summarily dismissed.

The applicant is a native and a citizen of Vietnam who was found to be inadmissible to the United States pursuant to section 212(a)(6)(C)(i) of the Immigration and Nationality Act (the Act), 8 U.S.C. § 1182(a)(6)(C)(i). He is the spouse of a U.S. citizen. The applicant is seeking a waiver under section 212(i) of the Act, 8 U.S.C. § 1182(i) in order to reside in the United States.

The Field Office Director concluded that the applicant had failed to establish that he was prima facie eligible to file for a waiver because he did not have a U.S. citizen spouse or parent, and denied the Application for Waiver of Grounds of Inadmissibility (Form I-601) on August 6, 2010.

On appeal, the applicant has not stated a purpose for the appeal or submitted any documentation.

8 C.F.R. § 103.3(a)(v) states in pertinent part that:

- (v) Summary dismissal. An officer to whom an appeal is taken shall summarily dismiss any appeal when the party concerned fails to identify specifically any erroneous conclusion of law or statement of fact for the appeal.

The AAO finds that the applicant's appeal fails to identify any erroneous conclusion of law or statement of fact in the field office director's decision. The appeal will therefore be summarily dismissed.

ORDER: The appeal is summarily dismissed.
