

no request for visa pending at this time. I then informed the Congressmen that, on the basis of the information I have at hand, I doubted very seriously that the Service would grant the subject a waiver of inadmissibility.

Congressman Podell stated that he has informed those interested in Lennon's admission to the United States that they must do two things before he will consider any further interest in the matter. He must have a letter from UNICEF giving precise details regarding the rally, what benefits UNICEF is to receive therefrom, what part Lennon is to play, and if Lennon is to appear gratis. Also, he has specified that Lennon must appear before the press and make a statement, which will be taped, wherein he details his views concerning the use of marijuana and other drugs, and such statement will be made available to the Congressmen so that he can evaluate whether it can be used to dissuade young people from engaging in drug and marijuana use.

I was informed today that at approximately 1:30 a.m. Radio Station WTOP broadcast a statement made by Lennon, wherein he said he wished to come to Washington to see President Nixon to give him some seeds that he might plant. Congressman Podell was informed of this broadcast.

P.S. Mr. Owen informed me this afternoon that the American Consul at Montreal has reported that John Lennon appeared at the Consulate today and made application for a visa to enter the United States for a period of ten days to tour and to consult with businessmen regarding recordings. He also stated that his wife has a U.S. citizen child by a prior marriage and she desired to have the child see its grandparents. The Consul also got a call from Elmer Fried, a New York attorney, who said he called pursuant to a request of Mrs. Lennon. Mr. Owen said the request for the visa will be referred to State and we will be further advised. There was no indication on the part of Mr. Owen that they would request a waiver in connection with this most recent application for a visa.

Dear Mr. Cunn:

Reference is made to your letter of May 19, 1959 recommending a 212(d)(3)(A) waiver for Mr. John W. O. Lennon, a British citizen.

The INS does not believe that the waiver of inadmissibility should be automatically granted in every case in which an alien desires to enter the United States. In exercising the Attorney General's delegated discretion, the Service is prepared to waive an alien's inadmissibility upon a showing of an important purpose or of a national benefit which outweighs the reasons why the application of the general law would exclude him. If, for instance, there is specific evidence that Mr. Lennon is prepared to make statements in the United States with respect to the problem of narcotics and drug abuse, which can be used in combatting the problem, particularly among juveniles, the Service would be willing to consider a waiver. As such evidence is not known to us, we are not prepared to authorize a waiver.

Dear Mr. Lehmann:

Mr. John W. O. LEMON, a British citizen, born October 10, 1940 in Liverpool, England, a member of the Beatles musical group, desires to enter the United States for a period of approximately one week beginning May 14, 1968, to discuss business with various film and recording companies in New York.

The applicant is ineligible for a visa under section 212(a) (23) of the Immigration and Nationality Act by reason of his conviction on November 28, 1968 for possession of cannabis resin. Embassy London's local sources advise that Mr. Lennon is not presently involved in any illegal activities of narcotics and Mr. Lennon has stated that he has not used narcotics since late 1967.

Senator Goodell's office has expressed considerable interest in having an interview with Mr. Lennon which might be distributed to teenage audiences in New York to help deter the use of drugs. Since Mr. Lennon is coming on a legitimate business trip and since it may be that Senator Goodell could in fact put his presence to good use, the Department recommends that Mr. Lennon be granted admission at New York for one entry for one week and no extension or deviation without prior approval of the Washington District Office, Washington, D.C. under the authority contained in section 212(d)(5)(A) of the Act.

Mr. Owen called and stated the question as to whether the Department of State will recommend a 212(d)(3) waiver has been before the Under Secretary of State who, in the absence of Secretary of State Rogers, is Acting Secretary of State. That officer has decided to have the Vice Office recommend a waiver.

A paper setting forth the entire matter was prepared in Barbara Watson's office and sent to the Under Secretary. That paper included the fact that Senator Goodell is interested in making a tape with Lennon. The paper continued, however, that Lennon and his manager gave no knowledge of any such arrangement but indicated they would be willing to cooperate.

In any event, Mr. Owen has prepared a letter addressed to me recommending a 212(d)(3) waiver.

Later today he called and stated he had received a call from Dr. Charles Dunn who is the principal staff officer in Senator Goodell's office. Dr. Dunn inquired as to exactly what was the status of the waiver request. Mr. Owen informed him the matter has now been sent to the Service and he gave my name as the person Dr. Dunn could call. Mr. Owen discussed Lennon's lack of knowledge concerning the taping and Dr. Dunn stated his office is now trying to confirm whether Lennon will appear on the taped show with the Senator. It is the Senator's belief that such a show would have beneficial effects on the teen agers in the New York area if Lennon would make constructive statements against the use of narcotics. Dr. Dunn also stated that unless Lennon intends to make such a constructive statement the Senator would not be interested in having Lennon come to the United States.

George Owen called and reported he received a call from Tom Luby of the Cunard Line yesterday. Mr. Luby reported that John Lennon and Peter Sellers were scheduled to board the Queen Mary last night and Lennon's lawyer said that even though he is inadmissible a visa would be issued on arrival and he was certain that a waiver will be obtained.

Mr. Luby called Mr. Owen to ascertain the true state of affairs.

Mr. Owen informed Mr. Luby that Lennon is ineligible for a visa. A waiver of his ineligibility has not been granted and he does not know if a waiver will be granted. Mr. Luby stated he knew the penalty for bringing an alien without a visa and he intended to call Southampton immediately to say that the subject should not be permitted to board the ship.

Mr. Owen also advised that it has been reported that a radio broadcast today stated the subject was kept off the Queen Mary.

I had several discussions with Mr. Marks concerning the cases of the subjects. He advised me that the subjects' immigration attorney, Leon Wildes, had, today, in response to Mr. Marks' telephone inquiry, advised that the subjects will not depart prior to March 15, the date fixed for their voluntary departure. It was determined that when Mr. Wildes appears at the New York Office tomorrow, March 3, 1972, to file an application for a third preference petition in behalf of the male subject, Mr. Marks should reiterate his inquiry as to whether subjects intend to leave by March 15th, and if the response is again in the negative, he should furnish Mr. Wildes with a letter advising him that in view of the subjects' refusal to depart within the time specified an Order to Show Cause and deportation proceedings will issue (and will be served upon Wildes as the attorney of record) notifying the subjects that a deportation hearing will be set for March 16, 1972. U

Mr. Greene advised Mr. Marks that it was the Commissioner's position that we should not approve any third preference visa petition in behalf of the male subject. U

Mr. Marks had at one time during these conversations notified me that an FBI agent from the New York Office of the FBI had conferred with an investigator in our New York Office concerning the subjects' whereabouts. This unidentified FBI agent indicated to the unidentified investigator that if the subjects were to initiate travel to Miami, the FBI would seek a warrant for subjects' arrest for violation of the federal statute prohibiting interstate travel in the furtherance of any conspiracy to incite to riot. This information was conveyed to Mr. Harlington Wood, Jr., Associate Deputy Attorney General, by Mr. Greene together with information that the male subject's attorney, Leon Wildes, had advised District Director Marks that his client had left for Houston yesterday




