

INFORMATION FOR DESIGNATED SCHOOL OFFICIALS: UPDATING THE STUDENT AND EXCHANGE VISITOR INFORMATION SYSTEM (SEVIS) FOR F & M STUDENTS





As a designated school official, you provide information to the SEVIS and that information affects the responses of SAVE Program.

The Systematic Alien Verification for Entitlements (SAVE) program is administered by the Department of Homeland Security (DHS). SAVE uses the information in SEVIS to confirm the immigration status of F and M students and their dependents who apply for a benefit so that the administering agency can determine the students' or dependents' eligibility for the benefit.

DHS requests that you fulfill your SEVIS reporting requirements by regularly logging into the system and reading all of your alerts.

What Your F and M Students Need to Know

If an F or M student wants to apply for a Social Security number (SSN), please refer him or her to the <u>Social Security Administration</u> for information about how to apply.

For driver s licenses, F and M students should check with their state licensing agencies for requirements and instructions specific to that state. DHS recommends students wait at least 10 calendar days after arriving in the U.S. before applying for either an SSN or a driver's license.
