



Applying for government benefits? Meet SAVE.

What is SAVE?

Government agencies use the Systematic Alien Verification for Entitlements (SAVE) Program to verify that you are eligible to receive public benefits, such as Social Security card, Medicaid, housing assistance, food stamps, or driver's license.

SAVE informs government agencies of your immigration status, so they can determine whether you are eligible for the public benefits they offer.

Tips to Get Quick Results

Following these tips will help you get quicker results:

1. Make sure your records are correct

If you changed your name or other information, you may need to correct your immigration record.

2. Show recently issued documents

If you received a new immigration document, you should present this to get faster results.

3. Check with your agency

Contact your agency regarding its procedures.

Following these steps helps SAVE continue to ensure that over 90% of SAVE cases are completed in just seconds.

Check your case with CaseCheck

After applying for a public benefit, you can follow the progress of your case online by using CaseCheck. CaseCheck is a fast and free service that gives you updates about when you should return to the benefit-granting agency to receive your benefit.

When using CaseCheck, be sure to use the same document information you provided to your benefit-granting agency. For more information about CaseCheck, visit www.uscis.gov/save/casecheck.
