Historical Processing Times Trends Fiscal Year 2016 - 2024

Overview: This factsheet provides historical national median processing times (in months) for all USCIS offices for select forms for fiscal years 2016 – 2024. In Table 1, the number of months shown is the median. It represents the time it took to complete half of the cases in a given time period. Table 2 shows the change in median processing times from the prior year.

Forms displayed include I-765 Application for Employment Authorization¹, I-821 Application for Temporary Protected Status, I-485 Application to Register Permanent Residence or to Adjust Status, I-130 Petition for Alien Relative, N-400 Application for Naturalization, I-131 Application for Travel Document, I-90 Application to Replace Permanent Resident Card, and I-129 Petition for a Nonimmigrant Worker.







- ⁶ In FY 2022 USCIS completed approximately 403,560 Form I-90s and had a backlog of approximately 845,100 cases. In FY 2023, USCIS completed more than 1,043,000 cases and reduced the backlog by more than 50 percent to approximately 414,350 cases. Because processing times are calculated from receipt date to completion date, when older cases are completed, processing times increase.

Note(s):

- 1) Processing times may differ from previously published reports due to system updates and post-adjudicative outcomes.
- 2) Processing times are defined as the number of months it took for an application, petition, or request to be processed from receipt to completion in a given time period. Visa regressed I-485s and revoked petitions or applications are excluded. Additional information on visa retrogression can be found on our <u>website</u>.

 3) Historical processing times are not comparable to the processing times posted on the USCIS processing times webpage for certain form types due to different methodologies (for example, cycle time methodology versus processing time methodology).
