Eligibility for citizenship and integration grants

- ✓ Are you a public or non-profit organization?
- ✓ Do you have experience providing citizenship instruction for 12 months out of the past 3 years (curriculum-based, using a citizenship textbook)?
- ✓ Have you or your community partners provided naturalization application services within the scope of immigration law to support lawful permanent residents for at least 12 months out of the past 3 years?
- ✓ Do you have a Department of Justice (DOJ) accredited representative employee on staff and are you recognized by the DOJ Office of Legal Access Programs (OLAP)? Or, do you have a paid staff attorney experienced with providing clients with naturalization representation?
