Dear Director Jaddou,

The House Committee on Small Business (the Committee) writes to inquire about the recent rule proposal to change certain immigration and naturalization benefit request fees charged by U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services (USCIS). This rule would increase immigration and naturalization fees for business visas and—as outlined by the Small Business Administration Office of Advocacy—the rule would pass substantial increases in fees onto small entities, along with a \$600 per person fee to subsidize the U.S. asylum program. It appears that the USCIS may not have properly considered small entities during this rulemaking process.

It is important for agencies to properly consider small businesses interests, which make up 99.9 percent of all businesses in the United States, when passing any new rule. America's small businesses deserve to have their voices heard and considered. We therefore request the following information as soon as possible but no later than June 23, 2023:

- 1. What are your statutory requirements to examine this rule's impact on small businesses?
- 2. How many small businesses will be impacted by this rule?
- 3. What additional compliance costs on small businesses are associated with this new rule?
- 4. Where can small businesses go to examine your analysis on the impacts this rule will have on their operations?
- 5. What alternatives have been considered to lessen the impacts on small businesses?
