Background on Presidential Pardons for Thanksgiving Turkeys (Note to Teachers)

Since 1947, the National Turkey Federation and the Poultry and Egg National Board have presented live turkeys to the President of the United States in a White House ceremony. The Presidents generally ate the turkeys up until 1963 when President Kennedy said, "Let's just keep him." In 1989, President George H.W. Bush was the first president to officially pardon the Thanksgiving turkey. Once pardoned, these special turkeys have gone to live out their natural lives in a petting zoo in Herndon, Virginia, or, in more recent years, in Disneyland and Disney World.
