SUBJECT: Venues for Administrative Naturalization Ceremonies

Purpose

U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services (USCIS) is issuing policy guidance in the <u>USCIS Policy</u> <u>Manual</u> to clarify the types of venues USCIS may use for administrative naturalization ceremonies and the considerations for accepting offers to donate use of facilities.

Background

Before becoming a U.S. citizen, an eligible naturalization applicant must take the Oath of Allegiance in a public ceremony.¹ USCIS may generally accept offers to donate use of facilities that do not present a conflict of interest and do not violate the Hatch Act.² To affirm USCIS' commitment to using neutral, nonpartisan facilities, USCIS is clarifying the types of venues USCIS may use for administrative naturalization ceremonies and the required procedures. This clarifying guidance also strives to educate the public and potential donors regarding the process for donating venue space so they can appropriately partner with USCIS. USCIS has a long-standing goal of promoting public understanding of the naturalization process.

This update, contained in Volume 12 of the Policy Manual, is effective immediately. The guidance contained in the Policy Manual is controlling and supersedes any prior guidance on the topic.

Policy Highlights

- Clarifies the types of venues where USCIS may hold ceremonies by providing a nonexhaustive list of commonly used locations and the considerations for accepting the donation of the facilities.
- Clarifies the process for potential donors of facilities to submit an offer to donate use of facilities.
- Eliminates the requirement for a donor to complete and submit an Offer of Gift from Non-Governmental Sources (Form G-1194).
