

DISCUSSION: The Director, Nebraska Service Center, denied the immigrant visa petition. The petitioner appealed and the matter is now before the Administrative Appeals Office ("AAO"). On February 26, 2009, the AAO received a letter from counsel for the petitioner, which stated that it wanted to withdraw the I-140 petition as the beneficiary was no longer employed with the petitioner. The AAO will accordingly withdraw the petition from any further processing. The withdrawal may not be retracted. *See* 8 C.F.R. § 103.2(b)(6).

ORDER: The appeal is dismissed based on its withdrawal by the petitioner.
