

**DISCUSSION:** The service center director denied the nonimmigrant visa petition. The matter is now on appeal before the Administrative Appeals Office (AAO). The appeal will be dismissed. The petition will be denied.

The petitioner submitted a Petition for a Nonimmigrant Worker (Form I-129) to Vermont Service Center on April 5, 2013. In the Form I-129 visa petition, the petitioner describes itself as a pharmacy established in 2012. In order to employ the beneficiary in what it designates as a pharmacy manager position, the petitioner seeks to classify him as a nonimmigrant worker in a specialty occupation pursuant to section 101(a)(15)(H)(i)(b) of the Immigration and Nationality Act (the Act), 8 U.S.C. § 1101(a)(15)(H)(i)(b).

The director denied the petition on August 28, 2013, finding that the new Labor Condition Application provided on August 22, 2013 was not certified prior to filing the I-129 petition. Thereafter, a Notice of Appeal or Motion (Form I-290B) was filed. We conducted a preliminary review of the record of proceeding and issued a Request for Evidence/Notice of Derogatory Information. The petitioner did not respond within the time period allowed in the notice, or any time since then.

If a petitioner fails to respond to a notice by the required date, the petition may be summarily denied as abandoned, denied based on the record, or denied for both reasons. *See* 8 C.F.R. § 103.2(b)(13)(i). As further provided in 8 C.F.R. § 103.2(b)(14), the failure to submit requested evidence that precludes a material line of inquiry shall be grounds for denying the petition.

As the petitioner has not responded to our notice, the petition is deniable under the regulatory provisions cited above. In the notice, we alerted the petitioner that failure to respond would result in dismissal since we could not substantively adjudicate the appeal without the information requested. Accordingly, the appeal will be dismissed, and the petition will be summarily denied as abandoned and denied due to the failure to submit requested evidence that precludes a material line of inquiry, making any remaining issues in this proceeding moot.

**ORDER:** The appeal is dismissed.
