



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

DISCUSSION: The service center director denied the nonimmigrant visa petition and the matter is now before the Administrative Appeals Office (AAO) on appeal. On May 19, 2009, the AAO received a copy of a March 28, 2009 letter to the beneficiary from the petitioner's Manager of Human Resources that constitutes a withdrawal of the appeal. The letter confirms that, as of March 27, 2009, the beneficiary is no longer employed by the petitioner and that the petitioner is no longer pursuing any immigration process on his behalf.

ORDER: The appeal is dismissed based upon its withdrawal.
