DISCUSSION: The Form N-600, Application for Certificate of Citizenship was denied by the District Director, San Diego, California (the director), and the matter is now before the Administrative Appeals Office (AAO) on appeal. The appeal will be dismissed as moot.

The applicant seeks a certificate of citizenship pursuant to former section 301(a)(7) of the Immigration and Nationality Act (the former Act), 8 U.S.C. § 1401(a)(7), based on the claim that he acquired U.S. citizenship at birth through his father.

In a decision dated May 14, 2012, the director determined that the applicant failed to establish that his father satisfied the U.S. physical presence requirements set forth in section 301(a)(7) of the former Act. The application was denied accordingly.

The applicant appealed the director's adverse finding on June 14, 2012, asserting that the evidence in the record establishes that his father met U.S. physical presence requirements set forth in the former Act.

Review of the record reflects that the director reopened the matter after issuance of the applicant's May 14, 2012 denial decision. The director subsequently approved the applicant's Form N-600 on November 20, 2012, and the applicant was issued a Certificate of Citizenship on November 28, 2012.

As the applicant's Form N-600 has been approved, and the applicant has been found to be a U.S. citizen, the instant appeal is no longer necessary. The appeal will therefore be dismissed as moot.

ORDER: The appeal is dismissed as moot.
