DISCUSSION: The waiver application was denied by the District Director, Mexico City, Mexico. The matter is now before the Administrative Appeals Office on appeal. On December 3, 2007, the applicant's spouse requested that the underlying visa petition (Form I-130, Petition for Alien Relative) be withdrawn. As the applicant's appeal requires an underlying petition, the appeal will be dismissed.
