We note that, if the self-petitioning alien chooses to appeal the director's decision, we will duly consider statements from officials of The Navigators, but as witness statements rather than as the petitioner's own arguments. Because there is, as yet, no valid appeal in the record, we will not examine, here, the basis of the denial. We will duly consider those factors if and when the self-petitioning alien files a proper and timely appeal.

The party that filed the appeal is not an affected party with legal standing in the proceeding. Therefore, we must reject the appeal as improperly filed. The director must serve a newly dated copy of the decision, properly addressed to the true petitioner.

ORDER: The appeal is rejected. The matter is returned to the director for the limited purpose of the reissuance of the decision.
