

**DISCUSSION:** The Temporary Protected Status (TPS) application was denied by the District Director, Newark, and is now before the Administrative Appeals Office (AAO) on appeal. The appeal will be summarily dismissed as moot, because the designated period of TPS for Liberia was terminated.

The applicant claims to be native and citizen of Liberia who is seeking TPS under section 244 of the Immigration and Nationality Act (the Act), 8 U.S.C. § 1254 for the registration period ending October 1, 2004.

TPS for nationals of Liberia (or aliens having no nationality who last habitually resided in Liberia) was terminated on August 25, 2004. TPS was again offered to Liberians; however, the applicant did not apply under the more recent designation. The latest designation was terminated on October 1, 2007. As the designation period for which the applicant requests TPS has passed, approval of the application at this time would serve no practical effect since any decision rendered by the AAO would be subsequent to the termination date of the authorized period.

**ORDER:** The application is summarily dismissed.
